Ursus Maritimus: The Polar bear is among the largest land carnivores,

Polar bears weigh in the range of 880 to 1500 pounds and are between 7 and 11 feet in length.

Polar bears have a white fur but a black skin.

Because polar bears live on the pack ice they are also known as "Ice Bears"

The main diet of polar bears is comprised of seals which they hunt either by stalking or by waiting by the seal's breathing hole in the ice.

There are five "polar bear nations" where the ice bears are found. These include the U. S. (Alaska), Canada, Russia, Denmark (Greenland), and Norway.

From late spring to December each year, polar bears gather where the Churchill River empties into Hudson's Bay. There they wait for the bay to freeze over so they can resume their annual hunt for seal

Thousands of tourist visit Churchill during this season to observe and photograph the bears.

The search starts at 5 am in bustling down town Churchill. The temperature is 15 degrees F.
